About the College: Mahishadal Girls' College is the Grant-in-Aided Women College in the District Purba Medinipur, established on 1st August, 1969. It was the first women's college in the district of Purba Medinipur. With an aim of imparting higher education among girls' students of the locality as well as other parts of this district and adjoining districts and to uplift and enhance their status, some local affluents viz. Late Dr. Satyendranath Bhunia, M.B., Late Rabindranath Singha, Late Dr. Haridas Sarkar, Late Gopal Chandra Mondal and many other eminent personalities of the locality took this glorious initiative. The college started its journey from a rented building in Rathtala, Mahishadal with a modest number of staff members and students. In 2003, the college was shifted to the Rangibasan village, about 1km away from its previous location. Previously, in July 1969, the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta. Mahishadal Girls' College is known for its diverse academic offerings, catering to students across multiple disciplines. Presently college offered various UG programmes (Major/Minor/ Multidiciplinary) offered under Vidyasagar University. And introduction of PG course in Master of Social Work added an extra feather to the academic journey of the College. The college provides students with some rare opportunities of non-formal training

courses from institutions of national and international repute. These courses include distant education at UG and PG level organized by Netaji Subhas Open University.

In the year 2018, the college was accredited by NAAC in the prestigious B Grade and remaining successfully with Arts and Science departments. The college is well known for its brilliant academic results, strict discipline and various extra-curricular activities. Mahishadal is mainly famous for Mahishadal Raj Estate and its Rathajatra festival. The grandeur of Rathajatra of Mahishadal is next only to 'Mahesh' of Srirampur (Hooghly). Besides, many historical events took place in the soil of Mahishadal, especially; it became an important fray of Indian Freedom struggle.

Alike Mahishadal, nearby Geonkhali is also a famous tourist spot. It stands at the conflux of the river Rupanarayan, Hooghly and Haldi, just opposite to Diamond Harbour Sub-Division of South 24 Parganas, and Howrah. Mahishadal is connected with different parts of Bengal and the outside of Bengal by both railway and bus route. CHANGE OF SUBJECT OR COURSE & PERCENTAGE OF ATTENDANCE / TRANSFER OF CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

Under special circumstances, change of subject may be allowed before the UG Registration form fill up every year provided by the Vidyasagar University. But such changes will strictly be guided by the existing University rules. Regular attendance in classes is the must. At least 75% of attendance in the classes is required for appearing any university examination and taking part in Students' Union Election. These apart, students must appear in all class tests for internal assessment round the year.

Transfer / Cancellation of Admission may be allowed within date published later on subject to payment of all fees for the 1st year. No Transfer/Cancellation of Admission will be allowed after this due date publishes later on.

PAYMENT RULES

- No payment is accepted without the Fee-Card, if the Fee-Card is lost or missing Rs.10.00 will be charged for a new one.
- All kinds of subsequent fees are received at the cash counter between 10.00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on all working days and on Saturday between 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.
- No transaction of fee is allowed except cash counter. Any breach of this rule is severely punishable.

The area of the newly constructed two-storied library building is 6500 sq. ft. The reading room on the first floor is 3000 sq. ft. and including research cubicles for teachers. Our college library is enriched with near about 20909 books, current and back volumes of 08 renowned journals and 08 other periodicals. It has a collection of 13 manuscripts. Besides serving the students and staff members of the college, it provides books to the departmental libraries also.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1) Hons. and General students both are being issued two lending cards for home issue.
- 2) The borrowed books are to be returned/renewed within 15 days from the date of issue.
- 3) Late fine are collected from the defaulters.
- 4) Lost/damaged books are to be replaced by the borrower.
- 5) All reading materials are to be returned by the students before form fill up for university examinations.

FACILITIES

Central Library provides reading room and lending services to our members. The other facilities are facilities of searching OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue), searching e-resources through NLIST programme of INFLIBNET, browsing the Internet etc. There is also a **Book Bank facility** for the economically backward students. The Library Stock is computerized with the help of SOUL 2.0. Bar-coding of books is near completion. We have automated our circulation from 2017-2018 session. Every year, the Library conducts User Initiation Programme for acquainting the 1st semesters students with the rules and

regulations of the Library as well as the techniques for searching OPAC, searching e-resources etc.

Reading Carrels have been installed in library reading section for serious scholars.

There is a hostel committee to look after the interest of the boarders. Boarders are to abide by all the rules and regulations of the Board of Residence, Vidyasagar University. Any violation of rules, must strictly be penalized. Considering the benefits of the students coming from poor and middle class families, the monthly seat rent of Rs.450.00 (to be revised) per month. Boarders are to pay all charges (excluding meal charge) in the college cash counter within the first week of every month. Defaulters are to pay a fine of one rupee per day.

Students intending to reside in the Hostel may apply in the prescribed form available in the college office at the cost of Rs.50.00 at the time of their admission in the college. The decision of the Hostel Committee is final regarding admission in the both inside and outside the college and hostel and the extent to which she observes the rules and regulations of the institution. Daily Programme for the boarders and all rules and regulations are subject to changes from time to time.
